## The Rosholt Free Community Fair

Held Here Two Days and Night, September 7th and 8th

The Rosholt Free Community Fair will be held on the grounds here two days and night, Monday and Tuesday, September 7th and 8th.

The committee in charge of the event are sparing no pains nor expense to make the fair this year out do that in former years. The grounds have been undergoing improvements for the past several weeks and are in excellent condition, and with weather permitting it is expected a larger crowd will be present than Rosholt has ever had the pleasure of entertaining before.

The Iola Boy's Band has been secured to furnish music for the

occasion, and the popularity of that musical organization will attract many to Rosholt.

Prof. Francis M. Ingler of Lawrence University will deliver an address on Monday of the fair, while on Tuesday Waldemar Acer, the noted Norwegian humorist, will address the audience in his native tongue.

There will be baseball games both days. Monday, Rosholt will play the Nelsonville team and on Tuesday Rosholt contests with Iola. Horse shoe pitching contests will be another feature both days of the fair.

A big program has been prepared for the first night of the fair. The band will give a concert. Also there will be a local talent program, and many other attractions for the enjoyment and interest of those who will be in attendance.

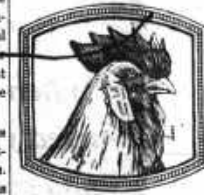
The merchants and business houses of Rosholt will have attractive booths on the grounds. Plenty of stands and concessions will be in readiness to take care of the needs of the throng.

Aviators with an airplane have been secured, who will carry passengers on short flights during the two days.

A merry-go-round for the kiddies, races, games of all kinds and different contests will be a plenty.

An extensive exhibit of farm produce as well as the poultry and calf clubs will be another attraction.

Folks make this a real home-coming. Rub shoulder to shoulder with your neighbors and merchant friends and spend a couple of days in Rosholt and enjoy yourselves.



## Origin of the Rosholt Free Community Fair

The Fair is not Conducted for Profit to Anyone or any Society. Make this the Big Year

The following is a brief history of the Rosholt Community Fair and its origin:

At a regular meeting of the Rosholt Advancement Association held in Rosholt on May 10, 1921, it was decided to hold a picnic in conjunction with the Portage county Guernsey Breeders Association, to be held at Hill Park on June 15th, the committee in charge of this picnic being P. J. Brehmer, M. B. Wolding and N. P. Krusicki.

Coffee, cream and sugar was furnished free by the association. This was the origin of what is now the Rosholt Free Fair.

On July 21st of the same year, it was decided at a regular meeting that they conduct what would be known as the

Farmers Merchants Picnic, to be held on Labor Day, September 1st, and the proceeds of the picnic to go towards the improvement of Hill Park. Efforts to say that the picnic was a big success, and it was then and there decided that it should be made an annual event. The committee in charge of this picnic were P. J. Brehmer, N. Larsen and N. P. Krusicki.

1922. At a regular meeting on July 11, 1922, it was decided that they again hold the Farmers Merchants Picnic on Labor Day, but that the occasion go under the name of the Rosholt Community Free Fair. This was a decided success, the total receipts for the day being \$225.76, and the total expense being

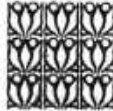
